RPS raise a staggering £7,500

● Each year staff from RPS (formerly Burks Green), on Sherwood Avenue in Newark support a local charity. During 2007/08 RPS staff supported Beaumond House Community Hospice and raised a staggering £7,500!

Money was raised through various events including: Staff Quiz Nights; various Raffles at Easter and Christmas, staff Christmas card contributions in lieu of sending cards to colleagues, along with various staff, client & supplier contributions. In a bid to increase the donation even further, an optional, preferential office car parking fee was also introduced to benefit those staff members who

would ordinarily have to use public carparks in the town.

The Newark office of RPS also holds an annual golf day for clients and raised money at this event via activities such as 'beat the pro' and 'nearest the pin' competitions.

Beaumond House have decided that through the fundraising efforts of the RPS staff, their donation of £7,500 will enable them to provide

833 hours of 'care in the community' in 2009 – more patients and their families will now be able to benefit from this unique and much needed service.

Nicola Tyszka, Fundraising & Marketing Manager commented, 'It is one of our objectives this year, in line with Government recommendations, that we increase our provision of 'Care in the Community'. We are extremely grateful that the donation from staff at RPS Newark office will enable us to start working towards that objective almost immediately'.

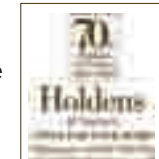


Collecting tins
